Prescribed (Masnun) Method of Salutation (Salām)

> 'Abdullah bin Mas'ud an narrates that we used to say in the prayer: 'Al-Salam be on Allah, Al-Salam be on so-and so.' So one day the Prophet said to us, 'Allah Himself is Al-Salam: when anyone of you sits during his prayer. he should say:

التَّحِيَّاتُ لِلَّهِ وَالصَّلَوَاتُ وَالطَّيِّبَاتُ، السَّلامُ عَلَيْكَ أَيُّهَا النَّبِيُّ وَ رَحُمَةُ اللَّهِ وَ بَرَكَاتُهُ ، اَلسَّلاَمُ عَلَيُنَا وَعَلَى عَياد اللَّه الصَّالحِينَ ، اَشُهَدُ أَنُ لاَّ اللهَ الاَّ اللَّهُ وَ اَشُهَدُ أَنَّ مُحَمَّدًا عَبْدُهُ وَرَسُهُ لُهُ

All compliments are for Allah and all the pravers and all the good things (are for Allah). Peace be on you, O Prophet and Allah's mercy and blessings (are on you). And peace be on us and on the pious worshippers of Allah. I testify that none has the right to be worshipped but Allah and that Muhammad is His slave and Messenger'. So, when you have said this, then you have surely sent the greetings to every good (pious) worshipper of Allah, whether he be in the heaven or on the earth. [Sahih al-Bukhari]

> Fatima says that whenever the Prophet of Allah entered the mosque he recited:

I enter the mosque in the name of Allah; Peace be upon the Messenger of Allah . O Allah! Forgive my sins and open the gates of mercy for me.

And when he left the mosque, he recited these words:

I exit (from the mosque) in the name of Allah; Peace be upon the Messenger of Allah . O Allah! Forgive my sins and open Your gates of bounties for me. [Sunan Ibn Majah]

Whenever 'Abdullah bin 'Umar returned' from a journey, he would visit the grave of the Messenger of Allah and make the following supplication:

ٱلسَّلاَمُ عَلَيْكَ يَا رَسُوُ لَ اللّهِ

'Peace be upon you, O Messenger of Allah !!

[Fadal al-Salāh 'ala al-Nabī]

Conveying of Salutations & Response

> It was narrated by 'Abdullah bin Mas'ud that the Messenger of Allah said: 'Some angels appointed by Allah go around on earth, and convey to me the salutations (salam) sent by my ummah.' [Sunan al-Nasa'i]

In the life of barzakh (stage of after life before Day of Judgment), the salutations (salām) are conveyed to the Prophet through appointed angels. How is it made possible? Regarding this we have not been given any knowledge. We should be firm in our belief that Allah has supreme power and nothing is impossible for Him; and that we should accept without hesitation, regarding matters which have not been revealed to us.

Prescribed Words of Blessings (Salah) for the Prophet

Send Your blessings on Muhammad and the family of Muhammad, as You sent your blessings on Ibrahim and on the family of Ibrahim for You are the Most Praise-Worthy, the Most Glorious. [Sahih al-Bukhari 1


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Peace & Blessings

Upon

Prophet Muhammad





بسم الله الرحمن الرحيم

Muḥammad ﷺ, the Last Messenger of Allah, is the greatest benefactor of humanity and a source of guidance for all Muslims. Loving him is an essential part of faith.

Anas bin Malik an narrates that the Prophet said, 'None of you will have faith till he loves me more than his father, his children and all mankind.' [Agreed Upon]

The best way to express love for the Prophet is to ask Allah to send peace and blessings upon him. Regarding this, Allah says in the Holy Qur'an:

'Indeed, Allah confers blessing upon the Prophet and His angels [ask Him to do so]. O you who have believed, ask [Allah to confer] blessing upon him and ask [Allah to grant him] peace.' [Al-Ahzāb:56]

The Arabic word 'Ṣalāh' means blessings, mercy and supplications. When attributed to Allah , the meaning of 'Ṣalāh' is that He sends His Grace and Blessings on the Prophet. With regards to the angels and people, it means that they make supplication to Allah to confer His blessings upon the Prophet. Another commonly used word for 'Ṣalāh' is the Persian word 'Durūd', which has been adapted in other languages as well.

The words سَلِمُوْاتَسُلِيْمُا further, make it clear that salutations of peace (salām) should also be invoked along with the supplication for blessings (Ṣalāh) for the Prophet المنافقة (ṣall Allahu alaihi wa sallam) whenever the name of the Prophet is heard, written or read is an act of great virtue and excellence.

Virtues of Invoking Blessings and Peace for the Prophet

Elevation of Status

Anas bin Mālik relates that the Prophet said, 'He who asks Allah to send blessings on me once Allah sends blessings on him ten times and removes from him ten sins and raises him by ten degrees.' [Sunan al-Nasā'ī]

Acceptance of Supplications

'Abdullah bin Mas'ud narrates: I was once praying and the Prophet, Abū Bakr and 'Umar (were all present). When I sat down (in the final tashahud), I praised Allah, then sent salām on the Prophet and started praying for myself. At this, the Prophet said, 'Ask (in this manner) and you shall be given! Ask and it shall be given to you!' [Jami' al-Tirmidhī]

Source of Blessings

'Abdur Raḥman bin 'Auf relates that the Messenger of Allah went out once and he followed him until he entered a grove of palm trees and prostrated. His prostration was so long that 'Abdur Rahman feared that Allah had taken his soul. 'Abdur Rahman came to look at him. The Prophet raised his head and said: 'What is wrong, Abdur Rahman?' Abdur Rahman mentioned what had happened and the Prophet said, 'Gabriel came to me and said: 'Shall I not give you glad tidings? Allah says to you, 'Whoever sends blessings upon you, I confer blessings upon him. Whoever sends salutations to you, I send peace on him.' Therefore, I prostrated to Allah in gratitude.' [Musnad Ahmad and Al-Hākim]

Relief from Misery and Sorrow

Ubbay bin Ka'b narrates: I said, 'O Messenger of Allah I, I send much blessings on you. What proportion of my du'ā should I devote to (sending blessings on) you?' He said, 'As much as you like.' I said, 'A quarter?' He said, 'As much as you like, and if you increase, it would only be better for you.' I said, 'Then half?' He said, 'As much as you like and if you increase, it would only be better for you.' I said, 'Then two thirds?' He said, 'As much as you like and if you increase, it would only be better for you.' I said, 'I'll devote all my time of supplication to sending blessings on you.' The Prophet said, 'In that case it will suffice you from your worries and your sins will be forgiven."

[Jami'al-Tirmidhī]

Disadvantages of Not Sending Peace & Blessings Upon the Prophet

- → 'Ali reported: The Messenger of Allah said,

 'The one in whose presence I am mentioned and does not send blessings on me is a miser.' [Jami' al-Tirmidhī]

- > 'Abdullāh bin 'Abbās in narrates that the Messenger of Allah said: 'Whosoever forgot to send peace and blessings on me strayed from the path of Jannah.' [Sunan Ibn Ma>jah]
- Anas bin Mālik stated that the Messenger of Allah said: 'No supplication is responded to until blessings are sent upon me.' [Sahih al-Jami' al-Saghīr]

When to Invoking Blessings (Salah)?

There is no restriction of time and place, nor are any special arrangements required for sending peace and blessings on the Prophet.

- > Whenever or wherever a believer supplicates for blessings and peace on the Prophet, it is conveyed to him. [Musnad Ahmad]
- > The Prophet has taught us to send peace and blessings upon him in the last part (tashahud) of the Salāh. [Jami'Tirmidhī]
- ➤ It is prescribed (masnun) to send peace and blessings upon the Messenger of Allah after the second takbir of the funeral prayers. [Musnad Shāfi i]
- > Sending peace and blessings upon the Prophet after hearing the call to prayer (adhan) and before making supplications is a means of receiving ten blessings from Allah. [Sahih Muslim]
- The supplication for peace and blessings made at the grave of the blessed Prophet is conveyed to him by the angels appointed for this purpose. [Sahih al-Jami'al-Saghir]
- > Supplications for the Prophet made on Fridays are presented to him. [Ṣaḥīḥ al-Jāmi' al-Saghīr]
- > The etiquette of making supplications, which have a greater likelihood of acceptance, is to first praise Allah, then confer peace and blessings upon the Prophet and then supplicate. [Jāmi' al-Tirmidhī]

- > It is recommended (masnun) to confer blessings upon the Prophet of Allah in every gathering, lest they may become a means of tribulations from Allah . [Jami'al-Tirmidhī]
- Sending blessings on the Prophet ten times in the morning and ten times in the evening will be a source of intercession on the Day of Judgment. [Ṣaḥiḥ al-Jami'al-Saghir]
- It is recommended to confer blessings on the Prophet at the beginning of sermons and preaching, at educational gatherings (especially when aḥādith of the Prophet are being taught), at the time of engagements or marriages, when writing or composing something and hence at the beginning of every righteous deed. It will be a cause for attaining Allah's mercy and facilitates the task at hand.

Unauthentic Practices

Regarding matters of religion, avoid unauthentic and innovative practices, which are a waste of time and energy, and a source of sheer loss on the Day of Judgment.

- ➤ The Messenger of Allah stated 'If somebody innovates something which is not in harmony with the principles of our religion, that thing is rejected.'

 [Agreed Upon]
- > Hāfiḍ bin Hajar says that it is preferable to use the words taught by the Messenger of Allah himself.

- > Supplication for blessings upon the Prophet that are not proven by the authentic traditions should be avoided, like Durūd Tāj, Durūd Muqaddas, Durūd Akbar, Durūd Lakhī, Durūd Mahī, Durūd Tanjīna and so on.
- > Sending blessings on the Prophet before the call to prayer (adhān), and aloud in congregation after obligatory prayers is not proven from any authentic tradition.
