

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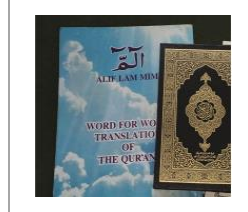

The Head Office is situated in Islamabad and is governed by a Board of Directors, which monitors all welfare projects and academic activities through a transparent system.

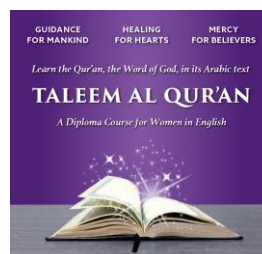

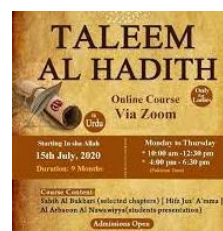
Overview of Programs

The staff not only kept the students attached to the course in a very efficient manner but also provided the best example of continuing the services of Deen in unfavourable conditions which will be a catalyst for significant change in the future lives of the students.

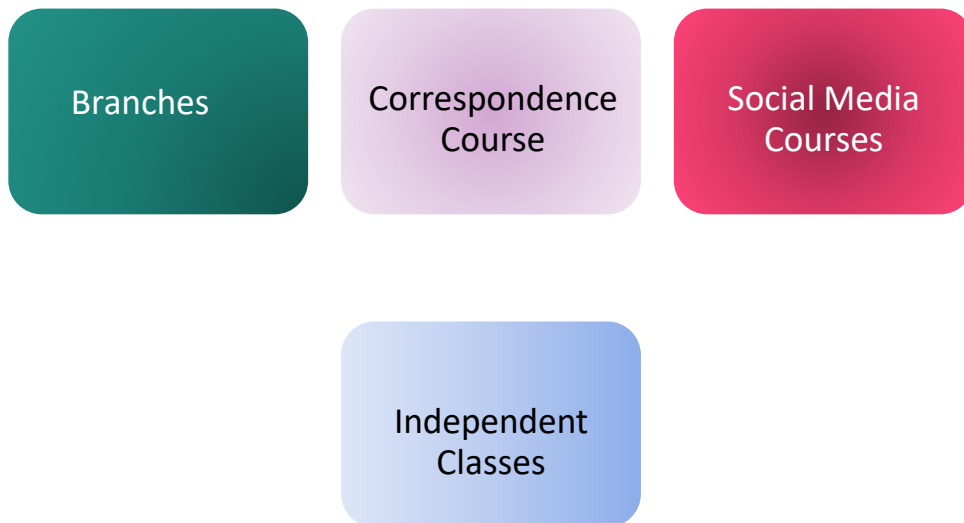
During the year, various scholars delivered lectures on campus as well as online which were also saved for the new students .

The Regions Office is situated in Al-Huda Head Office, Islamabad. It conducts all academic affairs across its regions within Pakistan and internationally. The Regions cover all Institutes, branches, classes, short courses, Social Media Courses, Correspondence courses, with their administration and all academic endeavours. Regions Office creates academic and social welfare policies and procedures for the smooth running of all its classes. It offers a range of options for all sorts of students of the Qur`an.



Al-Huda Institutes: These are our main academic centers, situated in Islamabad and Karachi in Pakistan and Mississauga, Canada. The Taleem al Quran Diploma is offered only in the registered institutes of Al-Huda.

Al-Huda Branches: Al-Huda branches were the first off-shoots of the Islamabad Institute. Dating back to 1996, these branches have grown in number over the years. The Branches offer all courses with certificates at the completion of the courses, except the diploma.

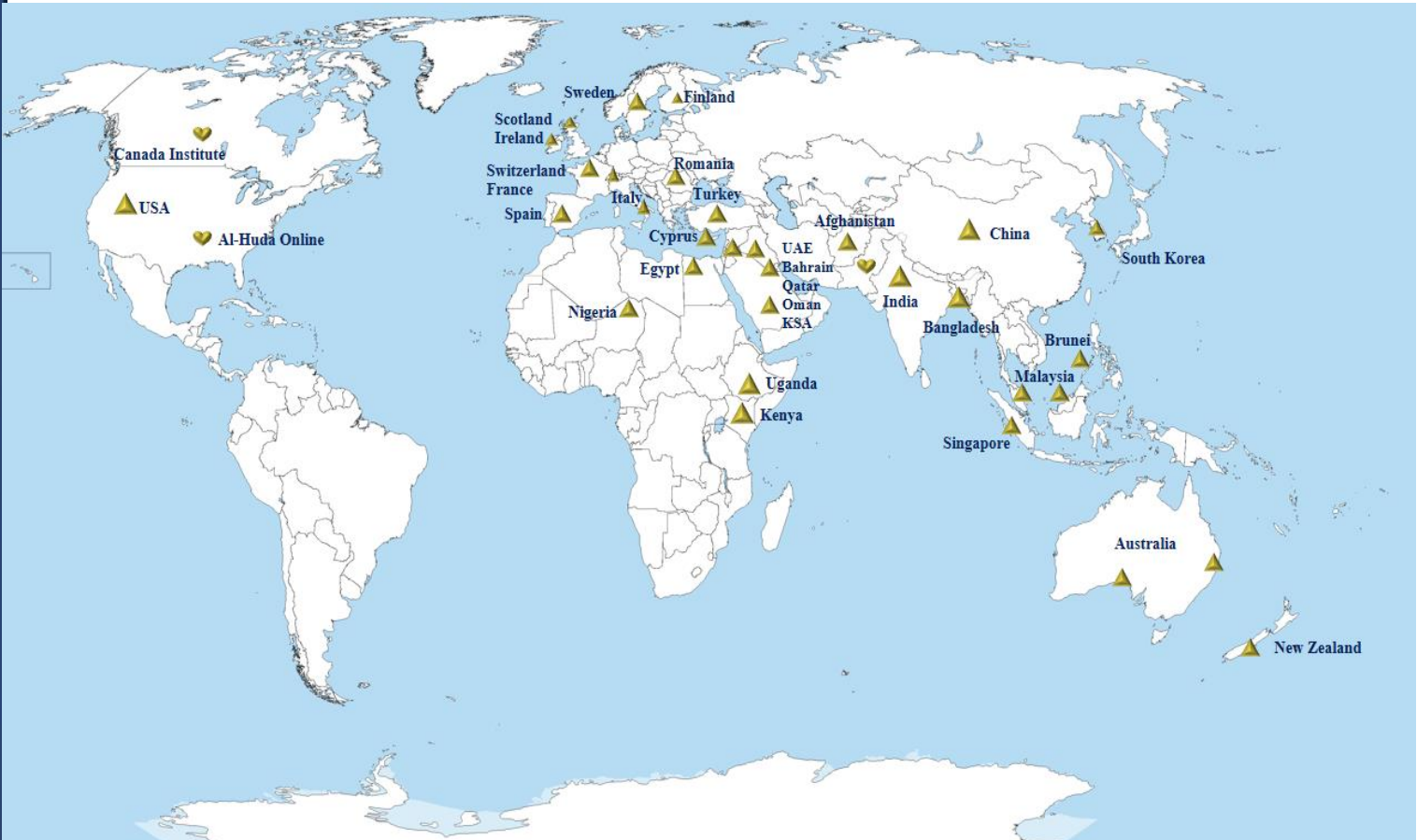
Al-Huda Classes: Any place be it a room in a house or a mat under a tent; that plays the recordings of Ustazah and the students give the Al-Huda exams is considered an official class.

Correspondence Courses: This is an option for those people wishing to complete the tafsir course on their own i.e., a self-paced independent course.

Social Media Courses: These courses started out in What Sapp groups but quickly developed into structured classrooms on Zoom. This option became especially popular during Covid-19 lockdowns. These courses follow weekly classes with a teacher present via zoom.

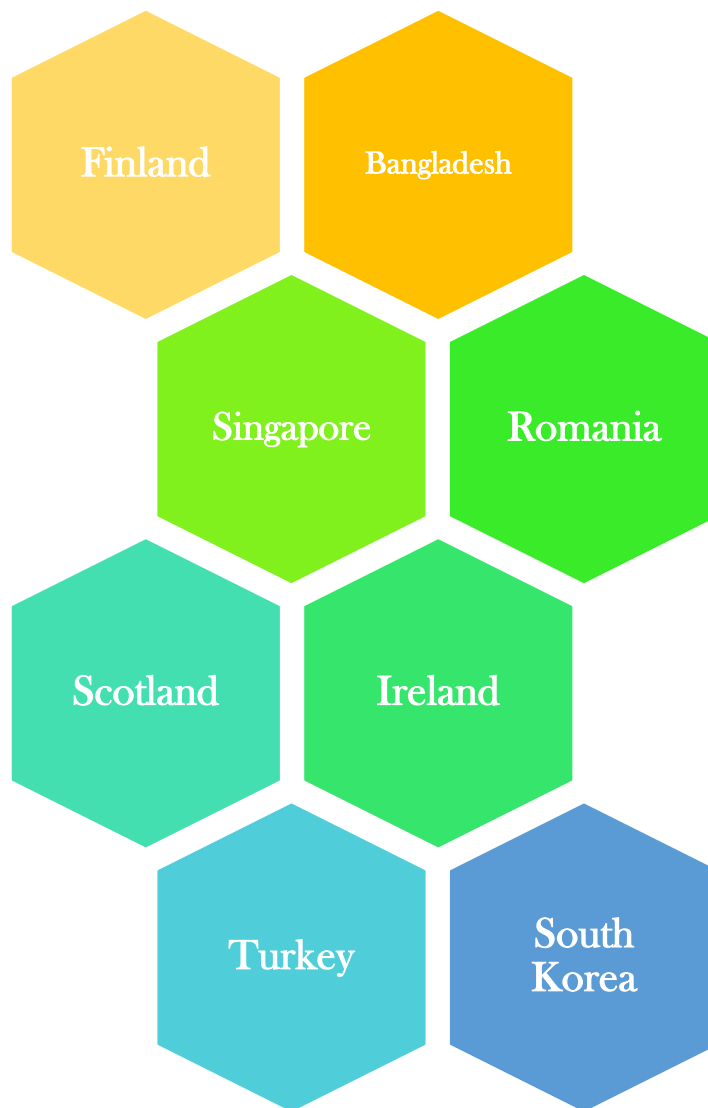

A major setback was the destruction of the North Nazimabad institute due to the heavy monsoon in August 2020. All their electronic equipment, books, furniture, and paperwork was damaged and useless. The institute had to be reconstructed all over again and all staff and students took an active part in the work, while keeping their courses running online. With Allah SWT's Mercy, the institute was rebuilt and is in an even better condition than before.

While most of our Karachi institutes and branches transitioned easily to the online platform, our hostel (Sirajuddaulah branch), Hyderabad and Sawt Al Qur'an students and staff faced some difficulties as they did not have proper internet facilities and received very weak signals for mobile data. One Tajweed teacher had to resort to taking classes on her rooftop as that is where she received relatively better signals; however, she fell ill in the winters due to exposure to the cold despite being under two blankets.

- Substantial work on review of Iqra and Roshni Ki Kiran and Roshni Ka Safar syllabus was carried out.
- We initiated system of Area coordinators for female classes for better monitoring and feedback from the system.
- We initiated Livestock livelihood project in which we provided good breed goats with kids to **16** deserving widows.

During Covid 19 Lockdown in Karachi, only **3** branches were conducting classes through WhatsApp groups, while other classes have been stopped due to unavailability of smart phones. In other districts of Sindh, **16** classes are going on as per routine, rest had to be closed due to unavailability of smart phones and network signal problems.

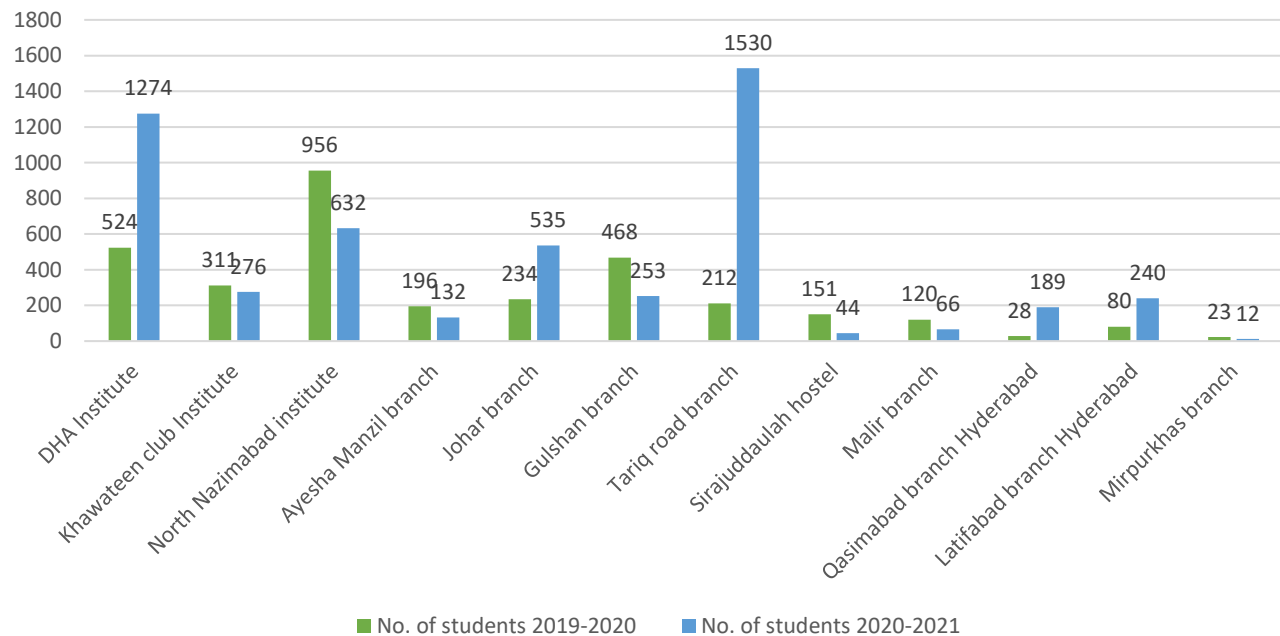

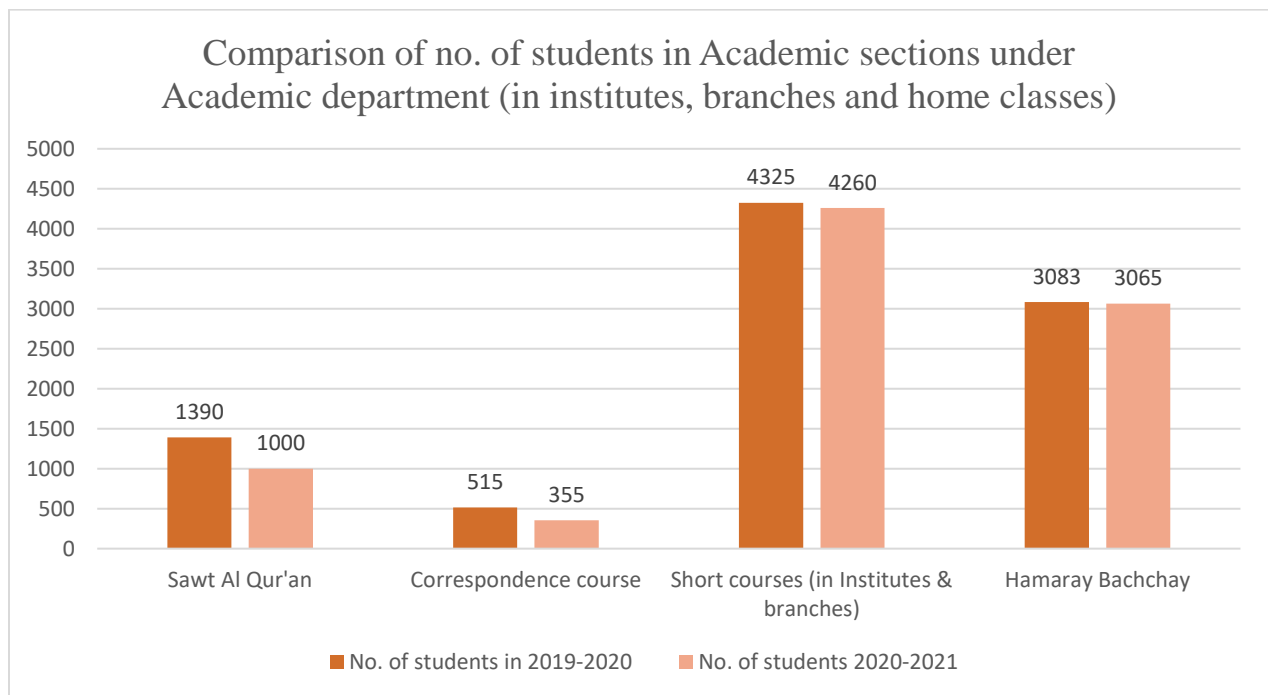
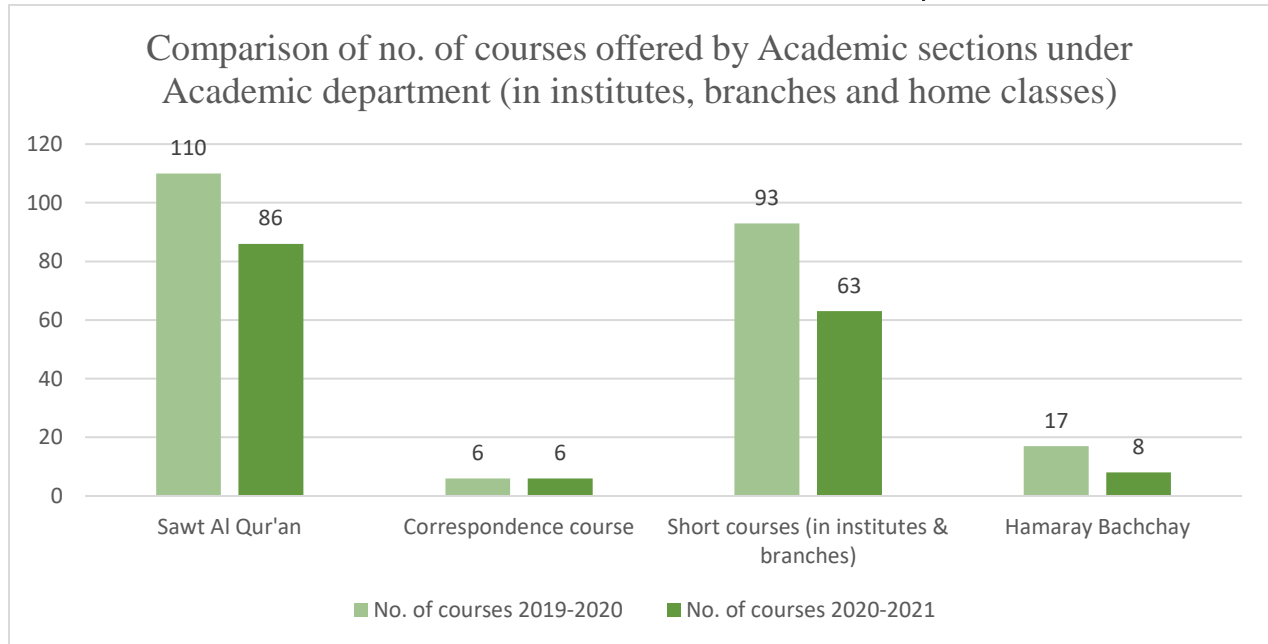


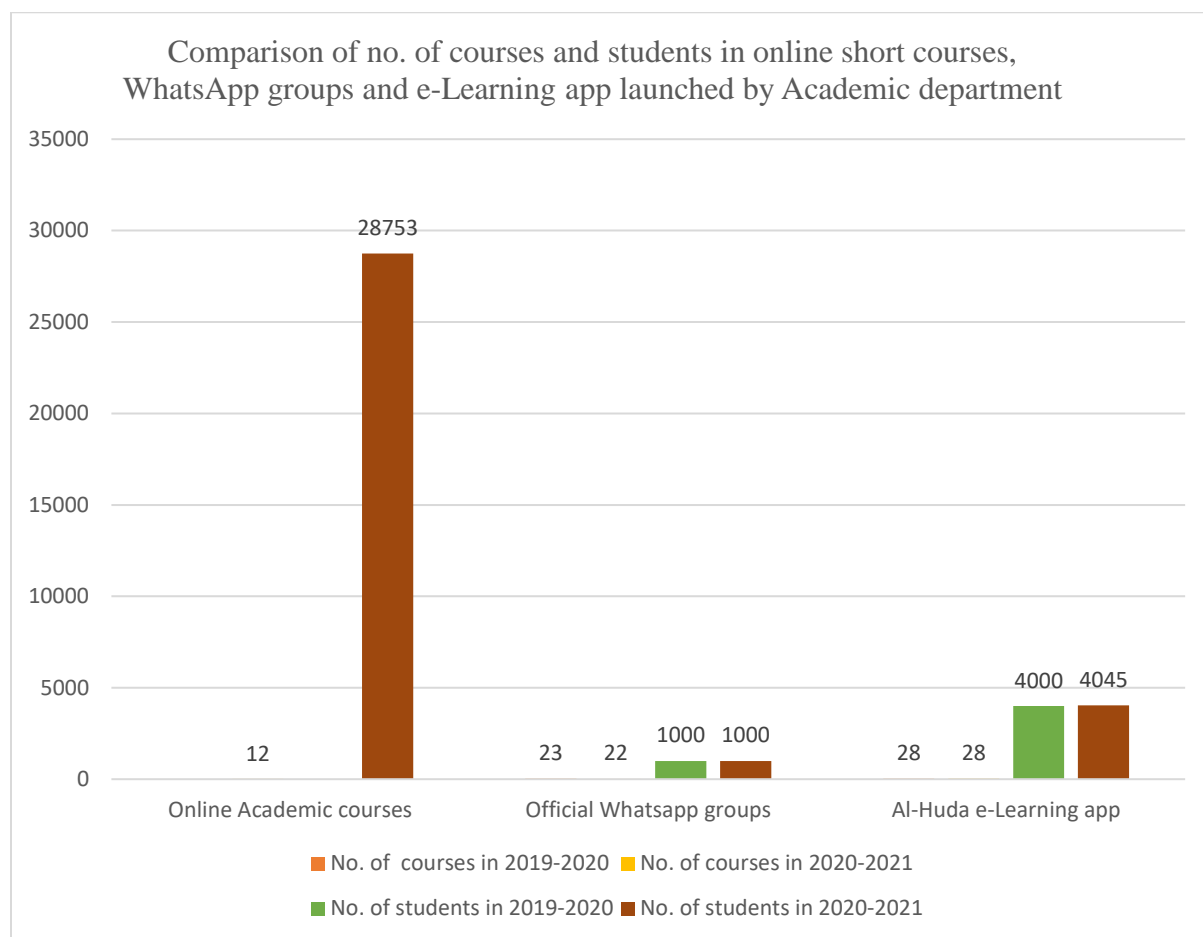
Comparison of no. of courses in institutes/branches from 2019-2021

Special Response to COVID-19

With orders by the government to close all institutions, Al-Huda Academic department took swift action and smoothly shifted its courses, trainings, and coordination work online. By the grace of Allah SWT, proper planning enabled us not to waste a single day and from the very next day of lockdown, our staff had learnt how to navigate online platforms; thus, classes continued online on Zoom and Facebook Live, while social media platforms were used to invite more people to attend classes. The Academic and Examination departments took all student registrations online and started using Google sheets for online assignments and exams. WhatsApp groups were created for course in-charges and coordinators to collectively guide them and take them onboard regarding key decisions in academic matters. Staff and students became technically skilled in utilizing different gadgets, applications, and social media. Power Point presentations were designed as a lesson resource so that classes remained interactive, and students could get visual learning cues that kept them focused. Once the lockdown was eased, our institutes and branches reopened and hybrid classes were conducted (on campus and via Zoom) while implementing all necessary SOPs.

Sawt Al Quran

- A **new online class** of Fehm-ul-Quran was started at Hostel.
- Most of the in-charges of Sawt-ul-Quran and Fahm-ul-Quran took admission in Surah Al-Rehman, Fiqh al-Qulub and Surah Al-Waqiyah online courses under the academic department.

It was based on the tafseer of selected surahs of Qur'an, 100 Ahadith, morning and evening supplications, learning word to word meaning of Ayat al Kursi and workshop on anger management with some needle work activities.



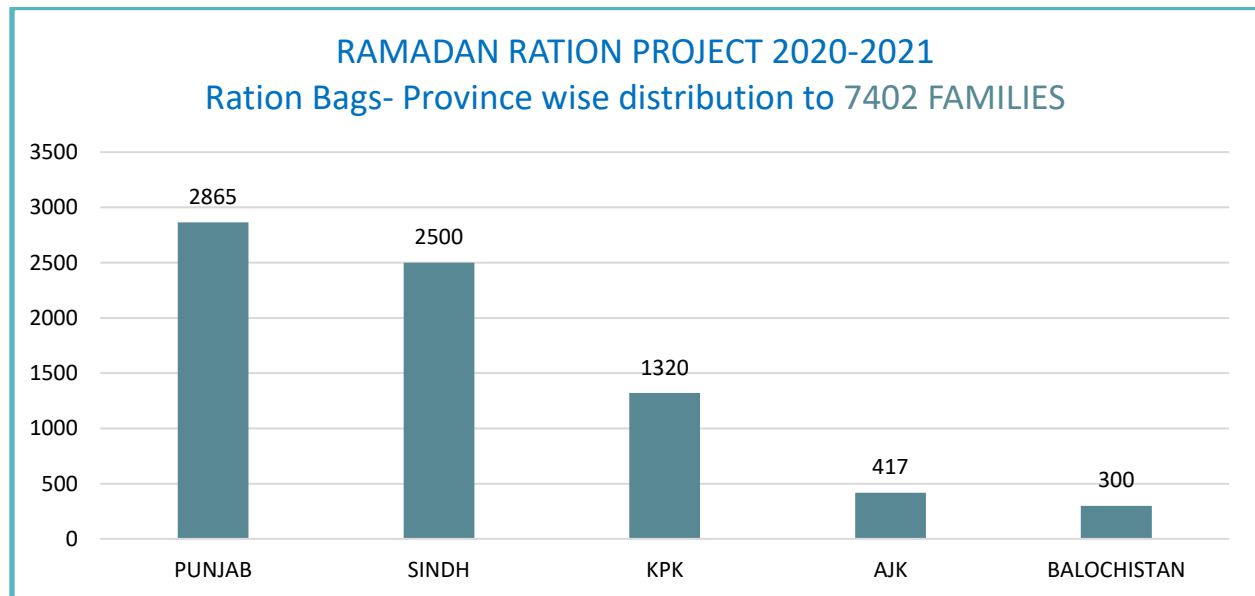

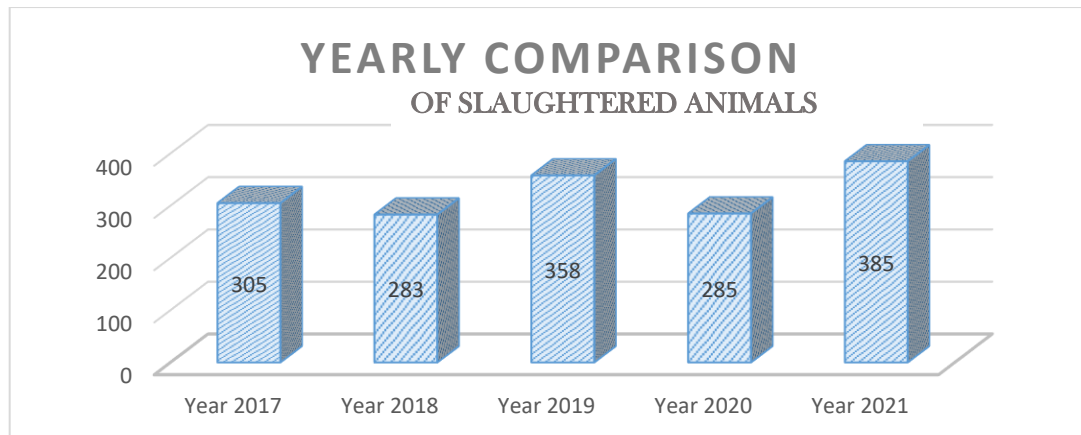

Ramadan Ration Annual Comparison



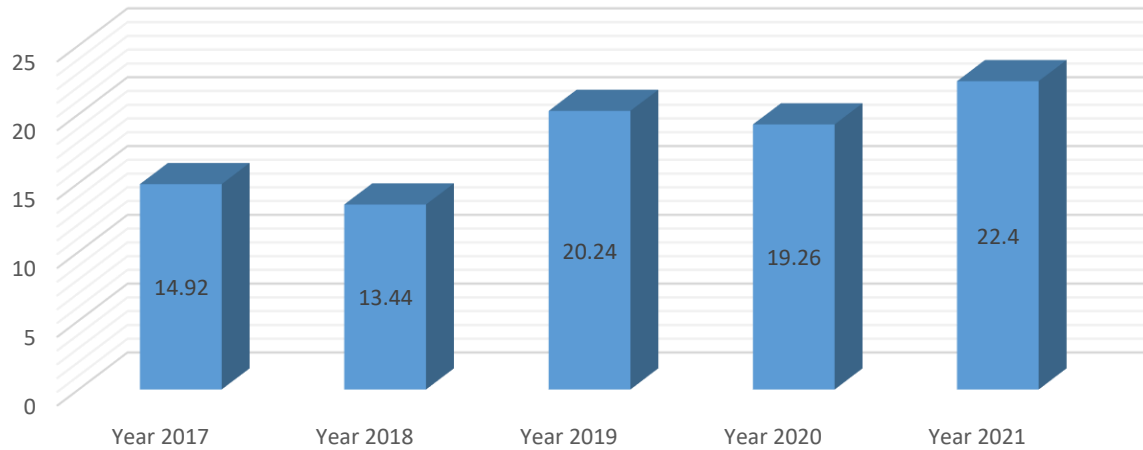

Yearly Compression chart of animals & Budget is as follows:





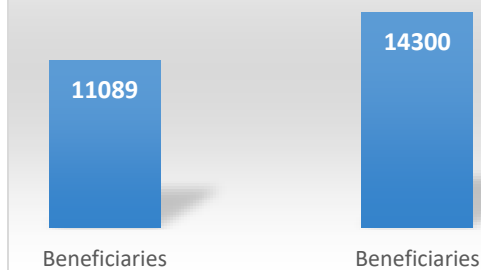
Yearly Budget Spend on Qurbani



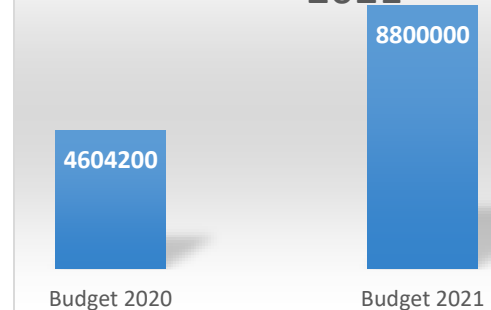
WINTER PROTECTION DRIVE

Budget Increase 2020 to 2021



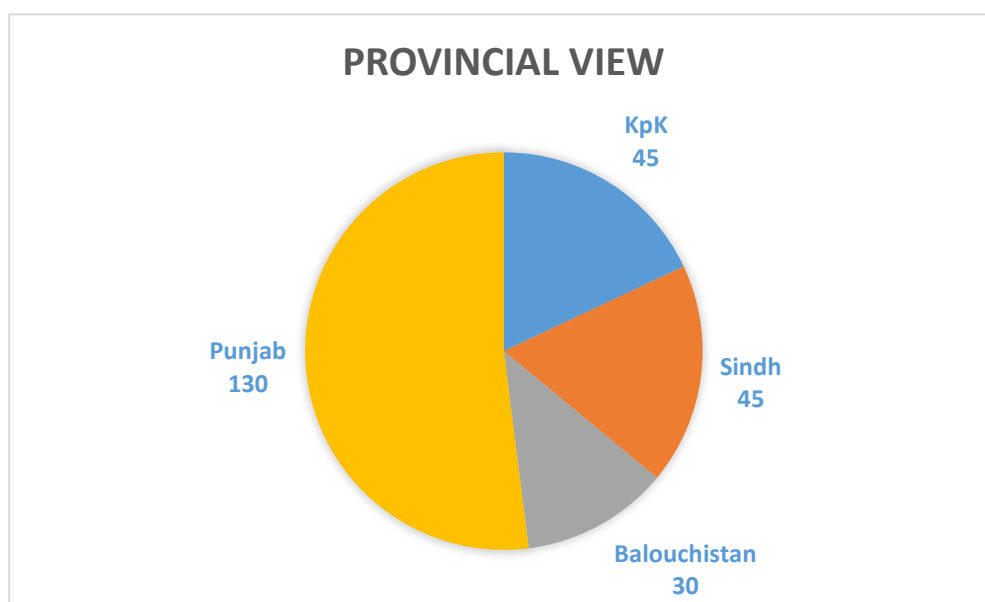
